

WOODFORD CEMETERY REGULATIONS

Purchase of lots in Woodford Cemetery may be made, and the Board of Cemetery Commissioners (hereafter referred to as "Board") on behalf of the Town, may only authorize sales of such lots, to full-time residents of the Town or to persons who are not full-time residents of the Town but whose parents, spouses, natural siblings or children have been buried in said cemetery.

All lots conveyed shall continue under the control of the board as to uniformity in the use, care and management thereof.

The Board reserves the right to have all work done in the cemetery under supervision and expressly reserves the right at any time to adopt new rules or to amend or repeal any rules or regulation or parts thereof.

No more than one interment will be permitted in any one grave and one cremation.

Interment of two cremations may be buried in pre-existing lots.

The Board reserves the right, in it's discretion, to limit the number of lots to six which any buyer or family may purchase at any given time.

Purchase price for each grave including perpetual care price is \$200.00.

No grave may be opened until perpetual care charge is paid in full.

The purchaser of a lot in Woodford Cemetery must cause to have set by the Board corner stones for lot markers measuring 4"x4"x12" and no deed will be issued until such lot markers are set.

Every earth interment shall be enclosed in a concrete box or vault.

No burial lots or rights incident thereto may be resold, assigned or otherwise transferred to anyone but the Town of Woodford Cemetery Commission.

Plot owner and his relatives may be permitted on cemetery plot. Any other person shall be considered a trespasser, and the town and its' Board of Cemetery Commissioners shall owe no duty to the trespassers to keep the property or the memorial thereon in a reasonably safe condition.

Shrubberies, trees and flowering plants are permissible

with the approval of the Board. The Board shall have the authority to remove all floral designs, flowers, weeds, trees, shrubs, plants or herbage of any kind from the Cemetery as soon as in the judgment of the Board they become unsightly, dangerous, detrimental or diseased or when they do not conform to the required standards.

The Board shall not be responsible for frozen plants or herbage of any kind, or for plantings damaged by the elements, thieves, vandals or any other causes beyond its control.

The lot owner is solely responsible whenever a grave is to be opened or a structure or foundation built thereon. No one may bury a casket before presenting the deed to the lot to a member of the board.

No disinterment shall be allowed until compliance with the Vermont State Board of Health has been satisfied.
